

Due to sustained population growth in the Matanuska-Susitna (Mat-Su) Valley and particularly in Wasilla, congestion along the city's main corridor, the Parks Highway, creates significant traffic delays during peak periods. As a result, the DOT&PF has identified the need for a future alternative highway corridor in the Wasilla area of the Mat-Su Valley, building on prior planning studies.
